SCHOOL TARGETS AND STRATEGIES

AP Targets:

For the class of 2018, 73% (or more) of students will be enrolled in an AP course, 60% or more students will take 1 or more AP exams in their high school career, and 47% of students will earn a 3 or higher on their AP exam.

AP Action Steps:

1. All teachers will infuse AP style lessons, assignments, rubrics, and standards into their curriculum.
2. Administrative team and Student Services (including the BSAP Achievement Liaison) will mentor students starting with our ninth graders and host family education evenings to promote students to enroll in advanced courses and register for AP exams.

SAT Targets:

For the Class of 2018, the target mean SAT is 1130 while increasing the current (62%) participation rate to 79.5%, and 51.2% of G12 students (110) will meet the College Readiness benchmark score of SAT ≥ 1190 while maintaining or increasing participation.

SAT Action Steps:

1. In order to impact SAT performance for all students, *all staff and all departments* will drive instruction by infusing and embedding SAT, AP, and PARCC style common assessments and common rubrics.
2. Student Services Team and Administrative Team will use SAT Counselor Report to identify students who have/have not registered for the SAT on a monthly basis, and strategically encourage students to retake/register for the SAT as well as participate in preparation courses and SAT help sessions.

Graduation Targets:

The graduation rate for the class 2018 will exceed 96%.

Graduation Actions Steps:

1. Staff will foster learning communities in their classrooms through the use student centered/guided and relevant lessons and the creation of inclusive learning environments. All staff will promote the theme for “unlimited possibilities.”
2. Administration and Student Services will counsel students to create customized schedules representative and reflective of the students’ interests and specific needs, as well as help students find success through enrichments and interventions so students feel involved, valued, and supported at Reservoir. The Administration and Student Services will create opportunities for students to connect with professionals in students’ interested careers.
